The Limits Of Technology

- A decrease in infant mortality
- An increase in life expectancy

- An improvement in transportation
- An ability to connect with anyone, anywhere, at anytime

The Limits Of Technology

There are many problems technology has solved, and there will be many more problems remedied by technology in the future. But despite the progress we've made with technology, there are two glaring problems it cannot resolve:

- The need for the gospel
- The need for face-to-face community



Examples Of Technology Mentioned In The Bible

Here are some examples of technology mentioned in the Bible:


- **Cain's City:** Cain built a city, indicating an advanced stage of civilization (Genesis 4:17).
- **Bronze and Iron Implement Makers**: Tubal-Cain is credited with making various bronze and iron implements (Genesis 4:22).
- Noah's Ark: Noah constructed a large vessel to survive the flood (Genesis 6-8).
- Tower of Babel: People built a massive tower to reach heaven, demonstrating advanced engineering skills (Genesis 11:1-9).



Examples Of Technology Mentioned In The Bible

Here are some examples of technology mentioned in the Bible:

- **Solomon's Temple**: King Solomon oversaw the construction of a grand temple in Jerusalem (1 Kings 6).
- Jesus's Craftsmanship: Jesus was a carpenter, utilizing tools and techniques of his trade.
- **Paul's Written Communication**: Paul used letters to communicate with his followers and share teachings.
- Sermon on the Mount Parables: Jesus uses examples of houses, city gates, and fishing nets in his parables to illustrate spiritual truths.

- Personal Devices: Fitness trackers, smartwatches, and wearable devices.
- **Health and Medical**: Biosensors, smart thermometers, connected inhalers, and other remote monitoring systems.
- **Agriculture**: Robots, sensors, GPS, and other precision farming tools.




The Source Of Technology

- These instincts find their roots in God, and they were passed along to you from him.




The Source Of Technology
